Untitled: Cathy Stone, A Solo Show

Cathy Stone's works, which include sculpture, neon sculpture, and painting /drawing, concern themselves with the reduction and refinement of cause or concern of time and the essential qualities therein. Work refers to the weight or presence of feeling in a physically manifest way. There is a tacit play with balance where one line can hold such a large mass. Gravity and balance, themes discussed in the work for years, reference concepts of existence, the spirit and the body. Many works have been created referencing breasts, testicles hanging and swaying - liquid weight.

Everything I do comes from acting/making a mark: drawing. It is always the beginning of my process, point of departure. My work balances between line in drawing and line sculpture; one has become the other.

The work exhibited at Sea and Space Explorations is from a series of "studies" for larger works that explore possibility regarding physically manifest form and line.
